 - At least one additional form: Virginia state identification card, valid Virginia vehicle registration or vehicle title, current original water, gas or electric department invoice, state or federal tax return filed within 12 months with W-2 form(s) attached, current original tax assessment statement, current voter registration card, or military ID
- Physical examination given **between dates of September 4, 2017 and September 4, 2018**
- Complete immunization record, including lead screening, hemoglobin, and urine checks.

Immunizations

To attend school, all children must have proof of the following immunizations: (Proof of immunization may be satisfied by PART III, Certificate of Immunization – form MCH-213C – available through the health department or a physician's office.)

DTP	FOUR doses of DTP with one of the FOUR administered after the fourth birthday. If any of these doses must be administered on or after the seventh birthday, ADULT Td should be used instead of DTP.
OPV	FOUR doses of trivalent OPV with one of the FOUR doses administered after the fourth birthday or three doses of EIPV with one of the three administered after the fourth birthday.
Measles	TWO doses of live virus measles vaccine, one dose given at 12 months of age or older and a second dose administered prior to entering kindergarten or first grade, whichever occurs first. Students entering sixth grade should also have had two doses of live measles vaccine, with the first dose administered at age 12 months or older and the second dose at least one month after the first dose.
Rubella	ONE dose of rubella vaccine received at 12 months of age or older.
Mumps	TWO doses of mumps vaccine with one at 12 months of age and a second before entering Kindergarten.
Hepatitis B	A series of three (3) vaccines that must be completed prior to entering Kindergarten.
ChickenPox	TWO doses received before entering Kindergarten

We believe students' mindsets are flexible and through effort, grit, self-control, and perseverance, students will gain a strong foundation for a lifetime of learning.

General Information

Hamilton-Holmes Middle School offers a comprehensive educational program to approximately 530 students in grades six through eight. Students receive instruction in four core subject areas of English, social studies, science, and math through a schedule which offers instructional blocks of 87 minutes. In addition, a daily 27-minute flex block is devoted to remediation, enrichment, character development, and homework assistance.

Eighth grade students may participate in the junior varsity athletic programs offered at King William High School and some band students will participate in the KWHS marching band. Students also participate in after-school clubs at the middle school level including the SCA, Junior Beta, Gentlemen's Club, Yearbook, Robotics and Odyssey of the Mind. The instructional program at Hamilton-Holmes is designed to accommodate and nurture the developing social, emotional, physical, and intellectual needs of young adolescents and prepare our students to be successful in high school.

Hamilton-Holmes Middle School will be hosting a sixth grade "Meet and Greet," on August 20th, at 6:00pm for all rising sixth grade students. Our Open House will be held on Wednesday, August 29th from 2:00pm through 7:00pm.

School Day

Office hours are from 7:55 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The students' school day begins at 8:10 a.m. and ends at 3:10 p.m. Students are not to be dropped off at school prior to 7:45 a.m. Students are dropped off and/or picked up along the designated curb area located in the student parking lot.

General Information

- King William High School will operate on an A/B block schedule for 2018-2019 school year. KWHS' curriculum is based on the Virginia Standards of Learning. Advanced courses are available in English, science, math, social studies, computer information, and foreign languages. AP courses are offered in history and science (classroom) and in other subjects (online). Dual Enrollment courses are available in English, marketing, economics, math, Spanish, computer, music, and agriculture. All Chesapeake Bay Governor's School and Bridging Communities Technical Center Courses are dual enrollment through Rappahannock Community College, or J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College. KWHS also houses an Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (AFJROTC) program.

- **Student use of personal electronic devices/cell phones is permitted in the cafeteria and hallways only!** Student use must also be in accordance with the division acceptable use policy (see the Code of Student Conduct.) Electronic devices should be stored away while in classrooms. Students are responsible for keeping up with their personal devices. Students may be given further consequences if students fail to abide by the acceptable use policy and school rules. Students will no longer have access to the “Guest” network and any electronic device/cell phone use will fall under their personal data plan.

NEW Cell Phone Disposition and Disciplinary Process for 2018-2019 - KWHS

- First violation - teacher seizure of student cell phone/electronic device, to be returned at end of current block.
- Second violation - teacher seizure of student cell phone/electronic device and given to administrator; to be returned at end of the current school day.
- Third violation - teacher seizure of student cell phone/electronic device and given to administrator; to be picked up by parent.
- Fourth violation - teacher seizure of student cell phone/electronic device and given to administrator, and 1 day of ISS assigned by administration.
- Fifth violation - teacher seizure of student cell phone/electronic device and given to administrator, and 2 days of ISS assigned by administration.
- Sixth violation - administration seizure of cell phone/electronic device, 2 days of OSS assigned by administration.

Medication: Consistent with King William County School Board policy, school personnel may not dispense medication, prescription or nonprescription, without written authorization from a parent/guardian which includes the name of the medication, exact dosage to be given, exact time dosage is to be given, and reason for medication. The medication must be in the original container with the original prescription label attached. **Students are not to have medication of any kind – prescription or nonprescription – in their possession during the school day, except in rare cases as designated by a physician.**

Student Parking Permits

Students who hold a valid driver’s license and who drive a personal vehicle to school must park in the student lot. A parking permit must be obtained by completing an application and by paying a \$40.00 fee (reduced to \$30.00, \$20.00, and \$10.00 after the first, second, and third grading periods.) *Vehicles parked without permits are subject to being towed at the owner’s expense.* Students must exit their vehicles and report to the building immediately upon entering and parking. Students must exit the lot immediately upon being dismissed from school. **Students are not allowed to return to their vehicles prior to dismissal.**

KWHS Athletics

King William is a member of the Virginia High School League, Group 2, Region A, and the Tidewater District. Students are invited to try out for any of our athletic or academic teams. Tidewater District events charge an admission fee of \$5.00 per person applying to all ages 5 and older. No one under the age of 12 will be admitted to any event without a paying, supervising adult. Prices are increased in playoff situations and rise with the level of competition in state events. All are encouraged to demonstrate good sportsmanship at events. School passes issued by individual schools, district, conference, or region will be honored only at the school that issued the pass. Only VHSL, VHSCA, VSBA, and VIAAA passes are accepted at playoff events. Pass holders may be asked to provide a photo ID and sign in at the pass gate. Only pass holders are admitted with pass; guests are not included.

King William Cavalier Cards may be purchased through the KWHS Athletic Department. The CAV CARD grants the purchaser admission to all KWHS home, regular season events. Individual cards are \$75.00, and a four-card family pack costs \$250.00. Contact the athletic director for more information.

Students participating in any King William VHSL activity must have passed a minimum of 5 courses the previous semester (excluding 8th grade junior varsity players). King William High School athletes must have attained and maintain a 2.0 grade point average to continue to be eligible to participate. Students may try out for teams regardless of their previous experiences, if they meet VHSL eligibility qualifications. Coaches and sponsors are looking for students with positive attitudes, who have enthusiasm and a strong work ethic, and would like to develop and improve their skills.
